

For those of you that attended the Volunteer Kick-Off on April 18, 2013 in the Hooper Building you experienced one of the new additions to LWAS in the form of a new screen and projector installed to aid with power point and video presentations. Thank you to Howard for his many hours of work installing the equipment and Lowell for his expert advice and being a standby consultant. There is also a projector in the Train Station thanks to our friends at EPHF. As members you will be treated to presentations in this format from now on.

During the month of March I attended two trade fairs representing LWAS. Well over 1500 cards and event brochures were distributed during these events. We continue to receive a large volume of hits on our website which is updated continually to remain relevant. Our events are listed on 1calendar.ca, Volunteer Leduc, and will be shown on the 3 E-Signs in Leduc. Increasing visibility and gate admissions are a priority. We are listed on the Edmonton Regional Tourism Group website and are offering a 2 for 1 gate admission for the July Exposition.

We will be participating in the Historic Edmonton – Open Doors on July 2 – 7, 2013 and will be open each day from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. We will be charging a \$5 admission fee to this event with children 12 and under free. We will need volunteers for this event, so if you can lend a few hours to be a guide/interpreter please call the office and let me know.

Howard Lengert, Marilynn Saramaga, and I attended a Policy and Board Development Workshop at which we learned how to develop policies that help guide the volunteers and members of a nonprofit organization. The LWAS Board has passed a motion that a committee made up of the three attendees of the workshop continue to develop policies for LWAS. We have had one development meeting so far and have found it to be a challenging task. If anyone has policy development experience, please let us know.

As I turned the page on the calendar this morning to May 1, 2013, I am enthusiastic about the future of LWAS and look forward to working with the new Board. My husband and son continue to work alongside me and are an immense help. I could not do what I do without them. #### Did You Know?

- You do not need to be a member of LWAS in order to volunteer. The membership renewals do contribute financially and you do receive a newsletter when you are a member.
- LWAS has 230 members: 80 have email addresses, 26 are yearly paid to date members, and 25 Lifetime Members have paid the \$10 newsletter fee. That leaves a large number of lifetime members that are inactive and are not receiving a newsletter.
- Lifetime members that pay their \$10 yearly newsletter fee will receive a membership card.
- Yearly paid members receive a membership card.
- LWAS is a non-profit registered Society in good standing. Google registered charities, and LWAS will come up in good standing.


