

Definitely it is winter this year with all of the snow. None the less our dedicated volunteers ventured out to the museum to work on projects at least once a week, as long as the temperature was half descent.

Work on #10 Rossdale turbine display is progressing nicely. The canopy over the HP turbine cutaway has been completed. A cover for the governor has been built and will be installed after it is painted. Work on the LP turbine cover continues. We still plan on building a structure to simulate a generator, which would double as a storage facility.

Last fall we received a GE Synchronous Converter and the lower half of the Mercury Arc Rectifier from the Edmonton Radial Railway Society. The mercury is being removed at Fort Edmonton Park and the bulbs should arrive at our museum site in the spring.

The Rossdale CCR control consoles have been moved to the museum and casters installed.

The strip of dirt between the turbine display pad and the building has been filled with gravel and sidewalk blocks placed on top. This will prevent weed growth and provide ease of access when viewing the display.

The EPHF Annual General Meeting was held at the Millwood's Golf Course on October 25, 2012. The first order of business was the election of directors, with Doug Harrish, Gary Millang, and Al Skoreyko being re-elected. Also, one new director, Keith Parry, was elected. The foundation would like to thank outgoing director, Ben Petrie for his contribution to the foundation. His knowledge and assistance at museum functions was greatly appreciated.

The Alberta Heritage Exposition Park sign will be taken down and stored while a decision is made as to where the Alberta Heritage Exposition Park name should be incorporated. The board has discussed registering the Alberta Heritage Exposition Park name in another jurisdiction to gain access to other fundraising venues, namely casinos. It is a constant struggle to acquire enough workers for the large amount of bingos that LWAS does each year. The LWAS bingo workers did 28 bingos last year. The thought is if we are able to do more casinos the work load on the same people doing the bingos and casinos would be minimized.

On April 18, 2013 come out to the Hooper Building. In an effort to engage the volunteers at LWAS we will be having a Volunteer Kick-Off at 7:00 p.m. The general public will be invited and this will be an advertised event to try to attract and inform potential new and old volunteers the opportunities that exist to become involved at LWAS. This is a dessert and coffee evening.

On November 17, 2012 the band <u>Tupelo Honey</u> shot their music video which will accompany their new CD release at LWAS. This particular band has played with Bon Jovi, which played Rexall Place last summer and has a song at #4 on the iTunes playlist. Band leader, Dan Davidson found LWAS on the net and contacted us through the new LWAS website. The band flew in a director from Vancouver to oversee the project. They arrived at the site at 6:00 a.m. and shot throughout the day until 12 midnight. It was very exciting for my son Josh and me to be involved and meet this hardworking, courteous and polite group of men. LWAS will be receiving credit every time someone views the video. It is expected that the video will be viewed by 15,000 people within the first week of release.

The BOD is currently reviewing the bylaws of LWAS. Some areas which are being considered for updating are: limiting the length of term of the executive positions on the board, and updating the duties of the positions held. The limitation of the length of terms will facilitate new ideas and be inclusive of those ideas. LWAS is growing and the bylaws need to be reflective of those changes.

It is very important that our upcoming AGM is well attended and you exercise your opportunity to elect your chosen representative to the BOD for 2013. See you at the AGM.

Did You Know?

- Leduc County cleans the parking lot and plows the roads at no charge to LWAS. We are fortunate to have a good friend in the Leduc County. Thank you.
- MCL Contractors which operates the Leduc Landfill donated three bins and the trucking to haul away the entire burn pile built up over the two decades that LWAS has been in operation. The total cost for this service is \$3,000, but the cost to LWAS FREE. Thank you.
- LWAS has a blog. The blog is connected to the website and is updated by Pam Bakker on a regular basis.

The year 2012 at Leduc West Antique Society proved to be quite successful financially. Our basic operating costs that include power, gas, fuel, insurances, equipment and building repair and maintenance generally run about 15,000 to \$20,000 per year. Any improvements that we wish to do on the site are over and above this amount. We were able to put in the concrete floor in the new Club Service Building, though we have no fund for doing improvements inside. We require bathrooms and power, and will be working towards that in the future.

The July Expos, the Casino and the Bingo proceeds prove to be our main sources of income. The Leduc Lions Breakfast Club contributed a goodly sum from their Bingo revenue and we did get a Financial Contribution from the Bill Smith Estate.

Several major contributors to our July Show included: Leduc County, Ertman and Helen Miller, Danin and Ron Bodnar, and Ritchie Bros. Auctioneers. Several other donations of smaller amounts helped the bottom line. In recent years we have paid for the Tractor Pull Announcer(s) and wish to thank Nadine and Dennis Morawski for contributing their time to help with our Pulls throughout the year.


The Edmonton Power Historical Foundation and the Canadian Western Blacksmith Guild add to the success of our Expo.

- The Garden Railway Exhibit is approved for the July Exposition in 2013.


January 8, 2013 – Executive Meeting Highlights
